Sec. 1 (a) At each General Convention the House of Deputies shall elect one Clerical and one Lay Deputy Clergy and Lay Orders, voting separately by order, shall each elect one person from its order from each Province as members of the Joint Nominating Committee for the Election of the Presiding Bishop. A Deputy from a particular Province may be nominated only by another Deputy from the same Province, but the election of each member of the Committee shall be by the entire membership of the House of Deputies, with a majority of those voting necessary for election. Prior to the election, the Clerical and Lay Deputies from each Province shall hold a caucus, at which two Clerical Deputies and two Lay Deputies as nominees shall be selected by the caucus, and these shall be the only nominees upon which the House of Deputies Clerical and Lay Orders shall vote in electing the members of the Joint Nominating Committee. The election of each such member of the Committee shall be by the entire membership of the Clerical and Lay Orders, with a majority of those voting necessary for election. The President of the House of Deputies, Co-Chairs of General Convention, acting jointly and after consultation with representatives of youth, shall appoint two persons, age 16-21, as members of the Joint-Nominating Committee for the Election of the Presiding Bishop.

(b) At each General Convention the House Order of Bishops shall elect one Bishop from each Province as a member of the Joint-Nominating Committee for the Election of the Presiding Bishop. A Bishop from a particular Province may be nominated only by another Bishop from the same Province, but the election of each such member of the Committee shall be by the entire membership of the House Order of Bishops, with a majority of those voting necessary for election. Prior to the election, the Bishops from each Province shall hold a caucus, at which the caucus shall select two Bishops as nominees shall be selected by the caucus, and these shall be the only nominees upon which the House Order of Bishops shall vote in electing the members of the Joint Nominating Committee.

- (c) In the event vacancies shall occur in the Joint Nominating Committee after the election of its members due to death, disability, resignation, or other cause within one year of the next General Convention, the vacancies shall not be filled and the remaining members shall constitute the Joint Nominating Committee. In the event such vacancies shall occur more than one year prior to the next General Convention, the Presiding Officer of the House of Bishops Bishop shall appoint replacemens for Bishops and the President of the House of Deputies Chief Lay and Clergy Officer shall appoint replacements for Clerical and Lay Deputies members, in all cases from the same Provinces as those Bishops or Lay and Clergy Deputies whose positions are being filled. An elected or appointed member who shall not be a Deputy to the next General

- 43 Convention shall continue as a member of the Joint Nominating Committee until the 44 adjournment of such next General Convention. A member of the Committee who

transfers from one Province to another or a Lay Deputy who is ordained Presbyter or Deacon, or a Presbyter or Deacon who is consecrated a Bishop, shall not thereby become ineligible to continue to serve on the Joint-Nominating Committee through the next succeeding General Convention.

(d) The Joint Nominating Committee shall remain in office until the adjournment of the next General Convention, at which <u>time</u> a new <u>Joint</u> Nominating Committee shall be elected. Members of the Committee are eligible for reelection.

(e) The Joint Nominating Committee shall develop and manage a process for soliciting and identifying qualified nominees for the office of Presiding Bishop and for providing the nominees to the General Convention at which a Presiding Bishop is to be elected. The process shall include (1) providing the names of not fewer than three members of the House Order of Bishops for consideration by the House of Bishops and the House of Deputies General Convention in the choice of a Presiding Bishop; (2) establishing a timely process for any bishop or deputy to express the intent to nominate any other member of the House Order of Bishops from the floor at the time the Joint Nominating Committee presents its nominees to the joint session of the two Houses General Convention, and for each Bishop so nominated to be included in the information distributed about the nominees; (3) providing pastoral care for each nominee bishop and his or her family and diocese; and (4) determining and providing for transition assistance to the Presiding Bishop and the Presiding Bishop-elect.

(f) At the General Convention at which a Presiding Bishop is to be elected, the Joint Nominating Committee shall present to the House of Bishops and the House of Deputies in Joint Session General Convention the names of not fewer than three members of the House Order of Bishops for the consideration of the two Houses General Convention in the choice of a Presiding Bishop. At the Joint Session to at which the Joint Nominating Committee shall presents its report, any Bishop or Deputy may nominate any other member of the House Order of Bishops for the consideration of the two Houses General Convention in the choice of a Presiding Bishop. Election of a Presiding Bishop shall be by concurrent vote of each Order, deliberating and voting separately, from among all such nominees. The affirmative vote of a majority of the Deputies of each Order shall be required for the election of a Presiding Bishop. - and there may be discussion of all nominees. Commencing on the day following the Joint Session, election shall be by the House of Bishops from among such nominees. If the House of Bishops General Convention shall find itself unable to elect a Presiding Bishop from among such nominees, another Joint Session election process shall be held, at which additional nominations may be received, and on the following day, election shall be by the House of Bishops General Convention from among all of the nominees-including those previously nominated. After the election by the House of Bishops, report of the result thereof, including the number of votes cast for each nominee on each ballot, shall be made to the House of Deputies which shall vote to confirm or not to confirm such choice of Presiding Bishop.

90 (g) In the event a vacancy in the office of Presiding Bishop shall occur in the interim 91 between meetings of the General Convention, as specified in the second paragraph of 92 Article I. Section 3 of the Constitution, the Joint the Nominating Committee shall, subject 93 to the said Article, shall within forty-five days of the occurrence of the vacancy, submit 94 to the Secretary of the House of Bishops the names of not fewer than three members of 95 the House Convocation of Bishops for the its consideration, the names of not fewer than 96 three members of the Convocatin of Bishops for consideration by that House in the 97 choice of a Presiding Bishop to fill the vacancy, and simultaneously therewith shall 98 transmit a copy of such report to the Secretary of the House of Deputies for mailing to all 99 Deputies notify the Presiding Deputy, who shall in turn notify all Lay and Clergy 100 Deputies. Such report shall also be released to the Church and secular press. Thereafter, 101 the House Convocation of Bishops shall hold a special meeting for the purpose of 102 electing to elect a Presiding Bishop to fill the vacancy, and in such election, the vote 103 shall be upon the nominees of the Joint Nominating Committee and any further 104 nominations made by any voting member of the House Convocation of Bishops. At the 105 special meeting the Convocation of Bishops shall, by the affirmative vote of a majority of 106 its members, elect a Presiding Bishop to serve until the next General Convention. 107 Immediately following the election by the House Convocation of Bishops, the Presiding 108 Bishop-Elect shall certify to Secretary of the House of Bishops General Convention, in 109 writing, the results of the election. The Secretary of the General Convention shall then 110 promptly inform the President and Secretary of each Diocesan Standing Committee. requesting a meeting at the earliest possible date to consider approval of the Presiding 111 Bishop elected by the Convocation of Bishops. The Presiding Bishop-Elect 112 113 of the General Convention shall also notify the Presiding Deputy, who shall notify all 114 Lay and Clergy Delegates of the results of the election. Upon receipt of the approval of a 115 majority of the Standing Committees of the Dioceses, the Presiding Bishop Elect shall be 116 declared elected.

Sec. 2. The term of office of the Presiding Bishop, when elected according to the provisions of Article I, Section 3 of the Constitution, shall be nine years, beginning the first day of the month of November following the close of the Convention at which the Presiding Bishop is elected, unless attaining the age of seventy-two years before the term shall have been completed; in that case the Presiding Bishop shall resign the office to the General Convention which that occurs nearest to the date of attaining such age. At that Convention a successor shall be elected, and shall assume office on the first day of the month of November following the close of that Convention or immediately upon the death, retirement, or disability of the Presiding Bishop. ; except that wWhen a Presiding Bishop has been elected by the House Convocation of Bishops to fill a vacancy, as provided for in the second paragraph of Article I, Section 3 of the Constitution, the Presiding Bishop so elected shall take office immediately.

Sec. 3 (a) Upon the expiration of the term of office of the Presiding Bishop, the Bishop who is elected successor shall tender to the House of Bishops General Convention a resignation from the Bishop's previous jurisdiction to take effect upon the date of assuming the office of Presiding Bishop, or, upon good cause with the advice and consent

138	(b) Such resignation shall be acted upon immediately by the House Order of Bishops.

140	Sec. 4 (a) The Presiding Bishop shall be the Chief Pastor and Primate of the Church, and
141	The Presiding Bishop shall also:
142	(1)(a) Be charged with responsibility for leadership in initiating
143	and developing the policy and strategy in the Church and
144	speaking for the Church as to the policies, strategies and
145	programs authorized by the General Convention;. The Presiding
146	Bishop shall have primary responsibility for the execution of the program and
147	<u>policies</u>
148	adopted by the General Convention and the coordination, development, and
149	implementation of the ministry and mission of the Church.
150	(b) The Presiding Bishop may, if he or she deems it appropriate to carry out the
151	ministry and mission of the Church between sessions of General Convention,

153	out new initiatives, with the approval of the Executive Committee.
154	(c) The Presiding Bishop and the Church General Manager, assisted by their
155	respective staffs, shall be responsible for generating drafts of reports to General
156	Convention for review and approval by the Executive Council and for providing
157	information requested by Executive Council in order to discharge its
158	responsibilities.
159	(d) The Presiding Bishop shall serve as the President of the Domestic and Foreign
160	Missionary Society.
161	(e) In consultation with the Executive Council, the Presiding Bishop and the
162	Presiding
163	Deputy may appoint ad hoc task forces that include or consist solely of persons
164	outside the staff of DFMS, if they deem that advisable in order to best implement
165	the Resolutions or the work of the Church. The members of the Task Forces shall
166	be proposed by the Presiding Bishop and the Presiding Deputy and be approved
167	by Executive Council. The term of the appointments to the Task Forces shall be
168	no longer than three years, unless members of the Task Forces are reappointed at
169	the end of their term.
170	(2) Speak God's words to the Church and to the world, as the representative of
171	this Church and its episcopate in its corporate capacity;
172	(3) In the event of an Episcopal vacancy within a Diocese, consult with the
173	Ecclesiastical Authority to ensure that adequate interim Episcopal Services are
174	provided;
175	(4) Take order for the consecration of Bishops, when duly elected; and, from time
176	to time, assemble the Bishops of this Church to meet, either as the House
177	Convocation of Bishops or as a Council of Bishops otherwise, and set the time
178	and place of such meetings;
179	(5) Preside over meetings of the House Order or Convocation of Bishops; and,
180	when the two Houses of the General Convention meet in Joint Session, have the

right of <u>calling for a meeting of General Convention presiding over such Session</u>, of <u>calling for such Joint Session</u>, of recommending legislation to <u>either House the General Convention</u>; and, upon due notification, of appearing before and addressing the House of Deputies; and whenever addressing the General Convention upon the state of the Church, it shall be incumbent upon both Houses the General Convention thereof to consider and act upon any recommendations contained in such address;

(6) Visit every Diocese of this Church for the purpose of: (i) Holding pastoral

(6) Visit every Diocese of this Church for the purpose of: (i) Holding pastoral consultations with the Bishop or Bishops thereof and, with their advice, with the Lay and Clerical leaders of the jurisdiction; (ii) Preaching the Word; and (iii) Celebrating the Holy Eucharist.

(b) The Presiding Bishop shall report annually to the Church, and may, from time to time, issue Pastoral Letters.

(c) The Presiding Bishop shall perform such other functions as shall be prescribed in these Canons; and, to be enabled better to perform such duties and responsibilities, the Presiding Bishop may appoint, to positions established by the Executive Council of General Convention, officers, responsible to the Presiding Bishop, who may delegate such authority as shall seem appropriate.

Sec. 5. The Presiding Bishop may appoint, as Chancellor to the Presiding Bishop, a confirmed adult communicant of the Church in good standing who is learned in both ecclesiastical and secular law, to serve so long as the Presiding Bishop may desire, as counselor in matters relating to the office and the discharge of the responsibilities of that office.

Sec. 65. The stipends of the Presiding Bishop and such personal assistants as may be necessary during the Presiding Bishop's term of office for the effective performance of the duties, and the necessary expenses of that office, shall be fixed by the General Convention and shall be provided for in the budget to be submitted by the Treasurer, as provided in the Canon entitled, "Of the General Convention."

Sec. 7 <u>6</u>. In the event of the disability of the Presiding Bishop, the Bishop who, according to the Rules of the <u>House Order</u> of Bishops, becomes its Presiding Officer, shall be substituted for the Presiding Bishop for all the purposes of these Canons, except the Canons entitled, "Of the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society," and "Of the Executive Council."

Sec. <u>§ 7</u>. Upon the acceptance of the Presiding Bishop's resignation for reasons of disability prior to the expiration of the term of office, the Presiding Bishop may be granted, in addition to whatever allowance may be received from The Church Pension Fund, a disability allowance to be paid by the Treasurer of the General Convention in an amount to be fixed by the Joint Standing Committee on Program, Budget, and Finance, and ratified at the next regular meeting of the General Convention.
